

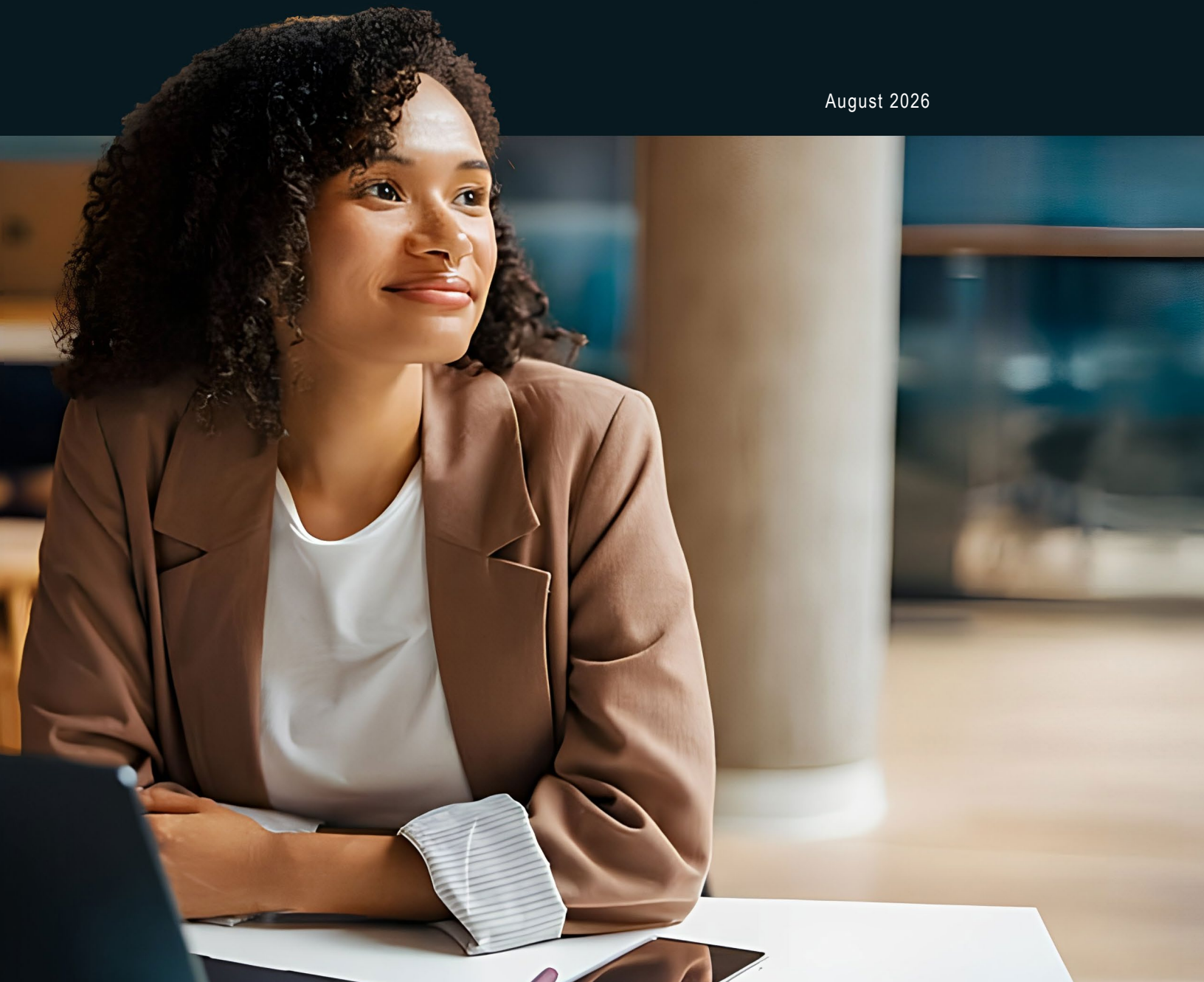
Management Foundations Program

Learning Experience

D2L Brightspace Learning Environment

Management Foundations Program courses are hosted in D2L Brightspace, a modern online learning environment designed to support flexible, meaningful professional learning.

Participants can engage with course content at their own pace while connecting with colleagues through webinars and reflective learning activities.

Each Course Includes

- Approximately 6 – 8 hours of self-paced learning
- Two facilitated webinars
- Practical leadership tools and resources
- Reflection and inquiry activities
- Role-specific leadership examples
- Knowledge checks and application activities
- Downloadable templates and planning tools
- Access to learning materials for two years

Course Design Features

Courses are designed around the realities of educational leadership and reflect the BCPVPA Leadership Competencies.

Participants will encounter:

Key Concepts

Short, focused learning segments that introduce foundational ideas and frameworks.

Leadership in Action

Examples and scenarios that connect concepts directly to leadership practice.

Competency Connections

Explicit links to the BCPVPA Leadership Competencies and the skills required for effective leadership.

Equity, Inclusion, and Reconciliation Reflection Pauses

Guided opportunities to consider leadership decisions through the lenses of equity, inclusion, Indigenous rights, and belonging.

Reflection and Inquiry Activities

Structured opportunities to connect learning to participants' own leadership contexts.

Practical Tools

Templates, planning guides, checklists, and resources that can be immediately applied in schools and districts.

Grounding Leadership in Relationships, Rights, and Responsibilities

Recognizing that leadership in British Columbia is grounded in relationships, rights, and responsibilities, the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) developed Relations With First Nations as a foundational course that underpins all Management Foundations Program learning.

Participants will explore:

- Historical, legal, and relational contexts
- Indigenous rights
- Local First Nations relationships
- Reconciliation commitments
- Their role in advancing equitable educational experiences for all learners

This course serves as a common foundation that informs and strengthens learning across the other six Management Foundations Program courses.

Choosing Your Learning Pathway

We recognize that professional learning needs vary depending on experience, role, workload, and learning preferences. The Management Foundations Program is designed to provide flexibility while maintaining opportunities for connection, reflection, and growth.

Participants can choose the pathway that best meets their needs.

WEBINAR Pathway

Some leaders value the opportunity to engage in professional dialogue, hear practical examples from colleagues, and participate in facilitated discussions.

Participants may choose to attend the live webinars associated with their course(s) and engage in the learning community without completing the online course requirements.

This pathway offers:

- Access to both course webinars
- Connection with colleagues from across the province
- Discussions and practical application
- Exposure to key concepts and current leadership practices

COURSE Completion Pathway

Participants seeking a deeper learning experience may engage fully in a D2L Brightspace course.

This pathway includes:

- Self-paced learning modules
- Reflection and inquiry activities
- Knowledge checks and application tasks
- Leadership tools and resources
- Participation in course webinars
- Opportunities to connect learning directly to professional practice

Participants who successfully complete all course requirements will receive a BCPVPA Management Foundations Program Digital Badge recognizing their learning and achievement.

PROGRAM Completion Pathway

Participants who complete all seven Management Foundations courses through the Course Completion Pathway will earn the BCPVPA Management Foundations Program Certificate.

The certificate reflects a significant commitment to professional learning and leadership growth across the core domains of school and district leadership.

Recognition of Learning

Digital Badges

A digital badge is awarded for each course successfully completed.

Participants may share badges within professional portfolios, learning records, and professional growth plans.
